IMAGINE WORKSHOP:

The Imagine crew have been working on connection: What we need to do to connect with ourselves, others and our environment.

Through play, games, task & performance we have been



exploring physical and vocal expression through emotion, situation and character. Each week our workshop has an underlying theme, helping guide the workshops and choices of exercises. Your children have embraced this way of exploration and discovery. They love boundaries and rules, so are great at playing. Our games have been based on openness, honesty and fairness and they're thriving with this framework in place.

QUIRK WORKSHOP:

The Quirk crew have been investigating what we need to create a great play, be а great work performer and effectively as a team. They have enjoyed concentrating on different elements of performance: space, time, character,



prop, costume, sound and further developing their understanding of what they need to create a great play. We learnt it can be hard to be vulnerable when we asked them to step outside their comfort zone – i.e. move to classical music, but they had to be brave to get through it. We leant kids have the potential to be brave and are brave! They want to do more script work, so we gave them some and boy they were amazing! Throughout the term, we will continue to build on the technical forms of expression and apply our learnings into a short-scripted monologue presented at the end of term in our in-studio showing!
