Did you think you would be doing online drama workshops? If you had asked me three months ago, the answer would have been 'No, are you kidding!" Just goes to show...never say never...

Are you enjoying the online workshops? Yes, and no! I mean, yes, it's been a great way to stay connected and creative. To be completely honest, it's been a positive distraction. It has kept me feeling hopeful during this uncertain time.

And no? I miss being in the same space as one another, feeling the energy of the group and deeply connecting in a way that being on screen and aware of your self does not easily allow.

What are some of the challenges? Adapting a new way of connecting, expressing, and communicating ideas and directions. One of the challenges on ZOOM is the order on the screen is not consistent for everyone, making it hard to know who is next in turn. Different internet connections, speeds and devices also can create lag issue making the workshop at times a little disjointed.

Any positives? Yes, being more structured in delivery, focused with themes and extra aware of inclusivity and language. Yes, absolutely! I will be a better teacher because of this experience. It has also opened possibilities to extend our customer base to connect with disadvantage, regional, remote, and cross generational groups, which I am thrilled about.

What have you missed the most? Circles and the organic nature of what we do, flow, impulses, and live interaction.



Learning performance art through the ABCD's of play

WORKSHOPS 1 - LIGHT:



Exploring **Light**. The spark! The opening, the beginning...Getting to know one another, setting up structure for our workshops and creating a safe & open space with emphasis on the importance of lighting and being seen. Both workshops contributed some wonderful creations for their #1 LIGHT TASK!



A few comments your children made about being OPEN:

"being open means being ready", "not blocking ideas from others", "if we weren't open, we would be closed"

WORKSHOP 2 - SOUND



Exploring **Sound**. Hearing, tempo, rhythm.

Creating soundscapes, being aware of the importance of hearing and articulating so people can understand you. Playing interactive games that are fair and inclusive. Using instruments, voice, and objects to create sound.



A few comments your children made about being FAIR: "everyone gets a turn", "being fair means, we are all equal",

"No-one is better than anyone else"

WORKSHOP 3 - PROP:



Exploring **Prop**. Touch, connection, believability. My favourite online workshops so far, we created a new interactive board game about being persistent and improvisations using props.

A few comments your children made about being PERSISTENT: "a performer has



to be persistent and practice all the time", "If a performer forgets their lines they have to keep going and never give

up", "Being persistent is like being resilient, when you fall down you get back up again"

WORKSHOP 4 - COSTUME:



So much fun exploring **Costume**. Smell, character choices. We discovered that costume is an important element to performance, it helps the performer become the character and the audience understand more about the character, era, style and environment.



A few comments your children made about being BRAVE: "you have to be brave in theatre, because the show must go on", "when talking in front of big groups you won't be

shy", "being brave is facing your fears – doing it anyway", "having confidence", "being vulnerable is being brave"

WORKSHOP 5 - SET:



This workshop our focus was **Set** (virtual & real) Taste, style, environment. We explored setting and why it is important in performance. We had special guest; professional dancer & performer Jo Scott join our workshops. She taught us her choreography and bought a



wonderful energetic energy to our ensembles.

A few comments your children made about being

CURIOUS: "asking questions", "wonder", "being curious is important for a performer because they need to investigate and make choices", "excited to find out how and why", "having interest in something you don't understand", "quizzical"
