Simone Avramidis interviewing Kerry Ireland on her theatre experience and her time working with GRiT...

#### What were you doing before you started working with GRiT?

For the past 3 years I've been working with the Sydney Theatre Company as the venue manager of the Roslyn Packer Theatre. While I was in Sydney I also worked at NIDA (National Institute of Dramatic Art) as the venue manager of the Parade Theatres. Before this, I worked for a variety of arts organisations throughout Australia, but have been most proud of working as the creative producer of the Feast Festival in Adelaide.

#### What brings you to GRiT?

Simone and I have been friends and colleagues for over 30 years, so when I decided to return home last Christmas, its seemed like a natural fit to work together again and start formulating a new and innovative youth workshop program.

#### What do you love the most about working with GRiT?

Apart from working with the gorgeous and talented Simone, being a part of the GRiT workshop program has given me the opportunity to connect with a different aspect of the arts industry. I love working with kids and being able to pass on my arts knowledge, it's an awesome opportunity to make some positive change in kids' lives.

#### Do you have any plans with the company?

I hope to support Simone in make the company bigger and better! We have created such a wonderful and innovative workshop program, so I would love to be part of making our program reach more kids both in the city and rural Australia.

### What is important to you?

Being kind and helping others.

#### How do you make positive change?

I believe positive choices make positive change! So, making positive change is about looking at all your choices and working out which choices have the most positive outcomes.

#### How have you personally found the pandemic? Any advice?

It's had its ups and downs, but overall, I've tried to remain positive. Even though we are living in a challenging time, it has shown me that with every obstacle also come new opportunities. My advice is, never give up, stay open, be brave and always look at the positives!

# WORKSHOPS 6 - SCRIPT:



Exploring **Script**. Text, words, language, and the story. We created stories and performed chosen scripts with one another.

A few comments your children made about being CREATIVE: "using your imagination", "having your own ideas and being unique", "different ideas



coming together", "if we weren't being creative we wouldn't be having fun", "thinking outside the box, you go

past it, expand and get better", "doing something you want to do by using your imagination"

# WORKSHOP 7 - CHARACTER:



Exploring **Character**. The who? Using all the skills we have learnt so far to develop characters through hotseat, mock interviews and improvisation.

A few comments your children made about being KIND: "love each other", "caring for others", "bullying someone isn't being kind, helping



someone is", "look after people", "being nice to people", "treat people like you want to be treated", "really trying to

understand how someone feels, having empathy", "helping the poor, treating all the same"

# WORKSHOP 8 - ACTION:



Exploring **Action**. The what, how & why? Character motives, improvusing conflict and resolution, action and obstacle.

A few comments your children made about being GRATEFUL: "if you have something and you're not grateful



and it breaks that's not being grateful', "you get what you

get and you don't get upset", "appreciation", "be grateful for the little things, like food, some people don't even have that so don't take it for granted"

# WORKSHOP 9 - DIRECTION:



So much fun exploring **Direction**. We were each given an orange script, working in partners, and taking direction. So clever and precise passing the orange through the screen.



A few comments your children made about being HUMBLE: "not

being the star", "being honest", "not boasting", "being modest", "seeing self as the same, an equal"

# WORKSHOP 10 - AUDIENCE:



Our last workshop of the term was back in the theatre! Wow, what a journey it has been. We did a workshop where we played with the 1.5m rule and where some meet for the first time. So wonderful being back in the space and seeing the kids again! A special night where we presented a



screening of our online play and celebrated GRiT Studio Collective turning 1!

The play was a combination of all the weekly tasks, expressed and delivered through any art form of their choosing (film, dance, visual arts, puppetry, music) and culminated in their very own online play! The kids were
